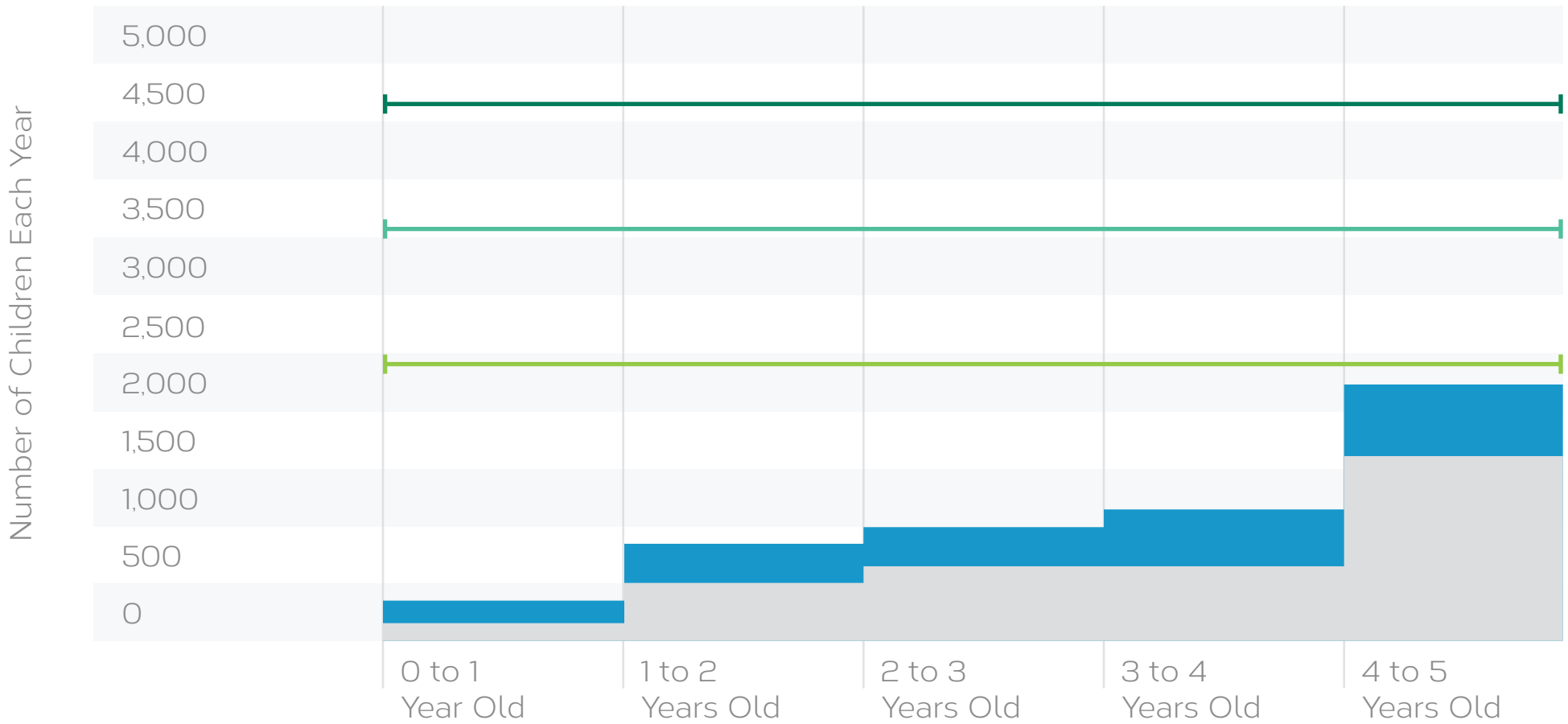

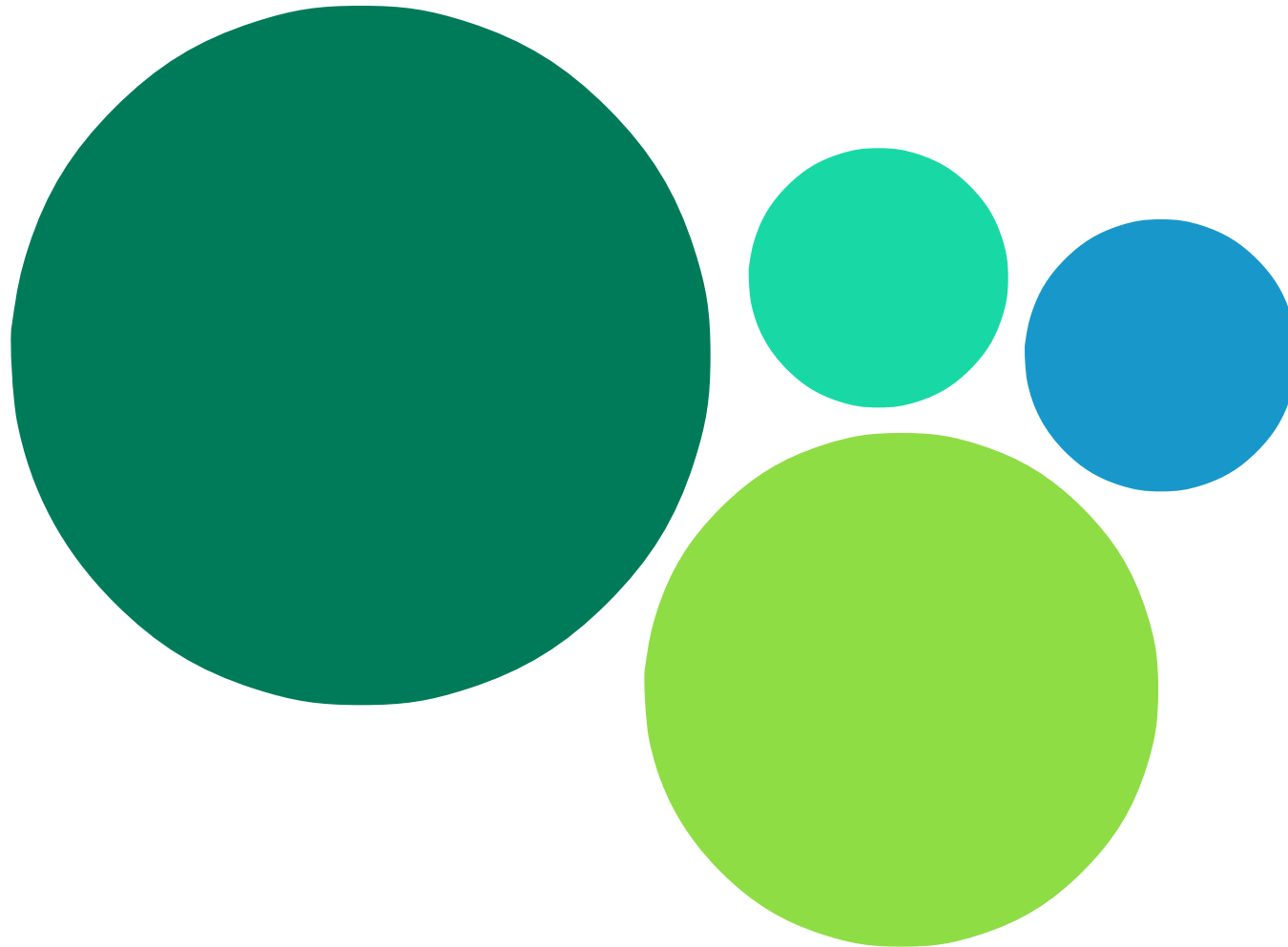

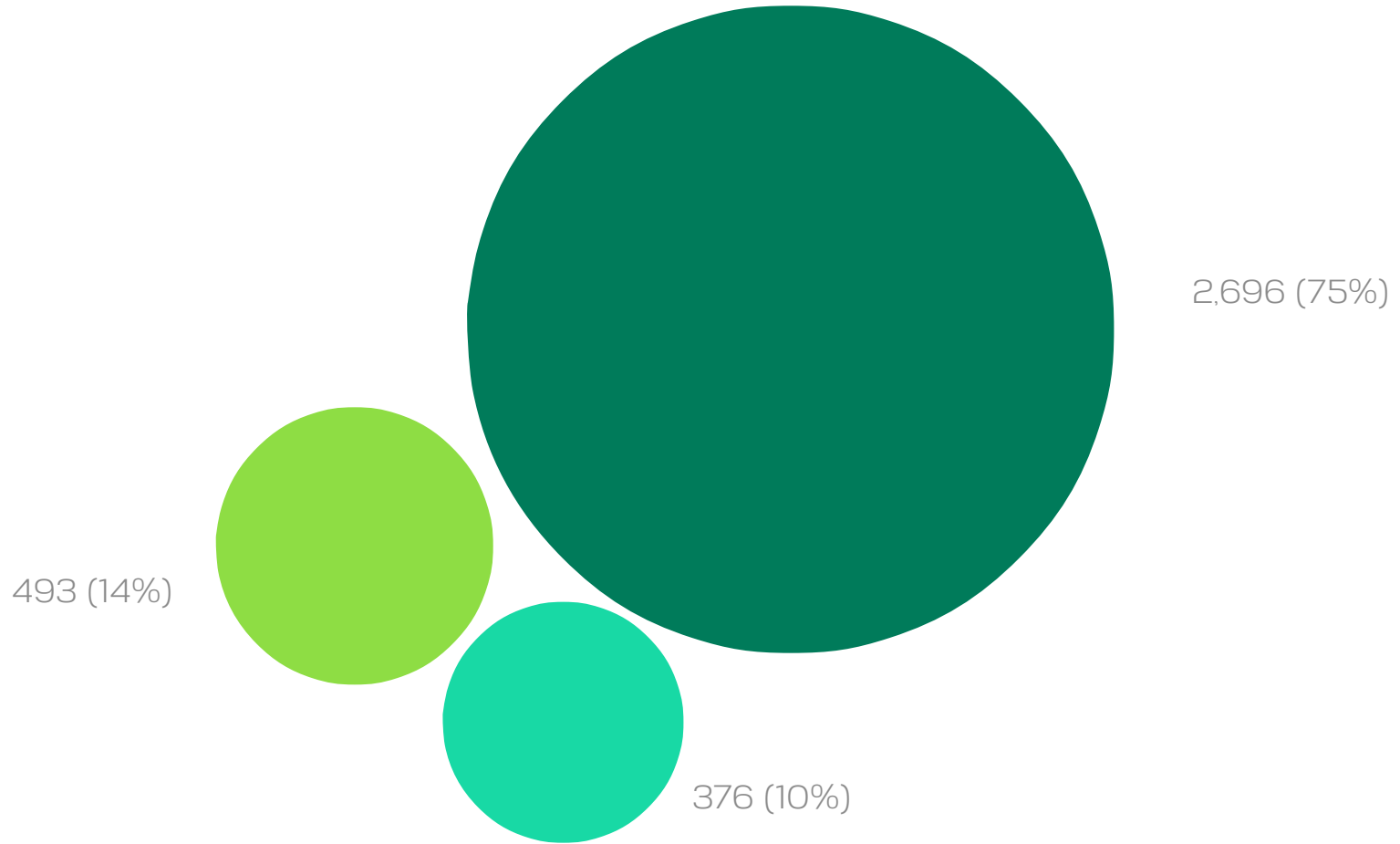
Subsidized Child Care and Pre-K – Waitlist

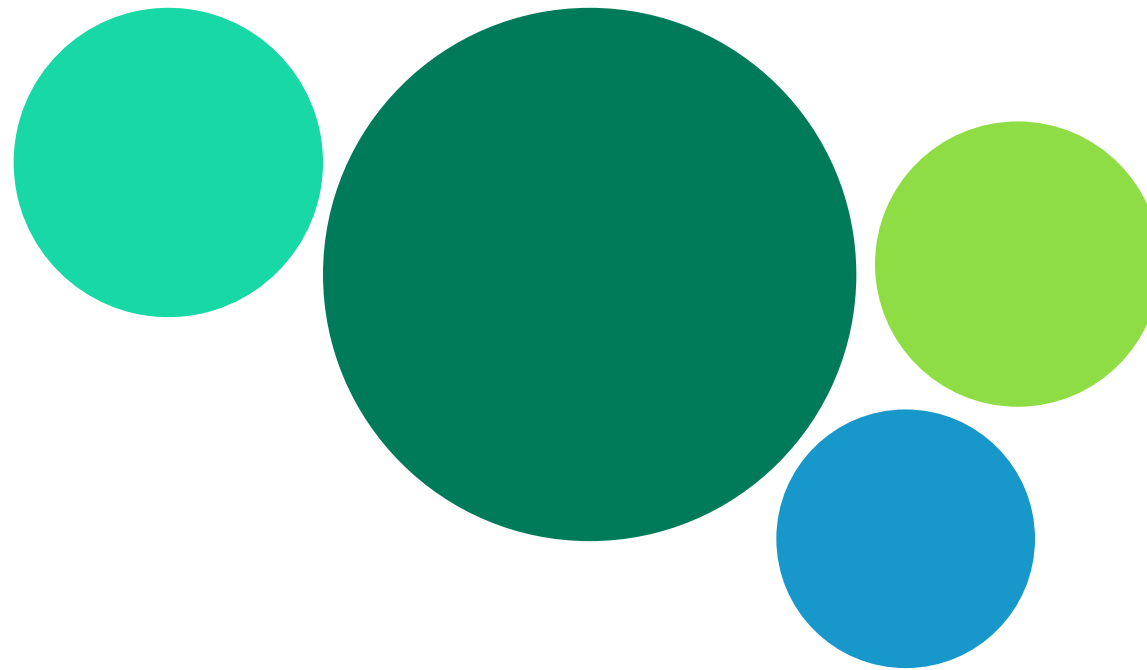

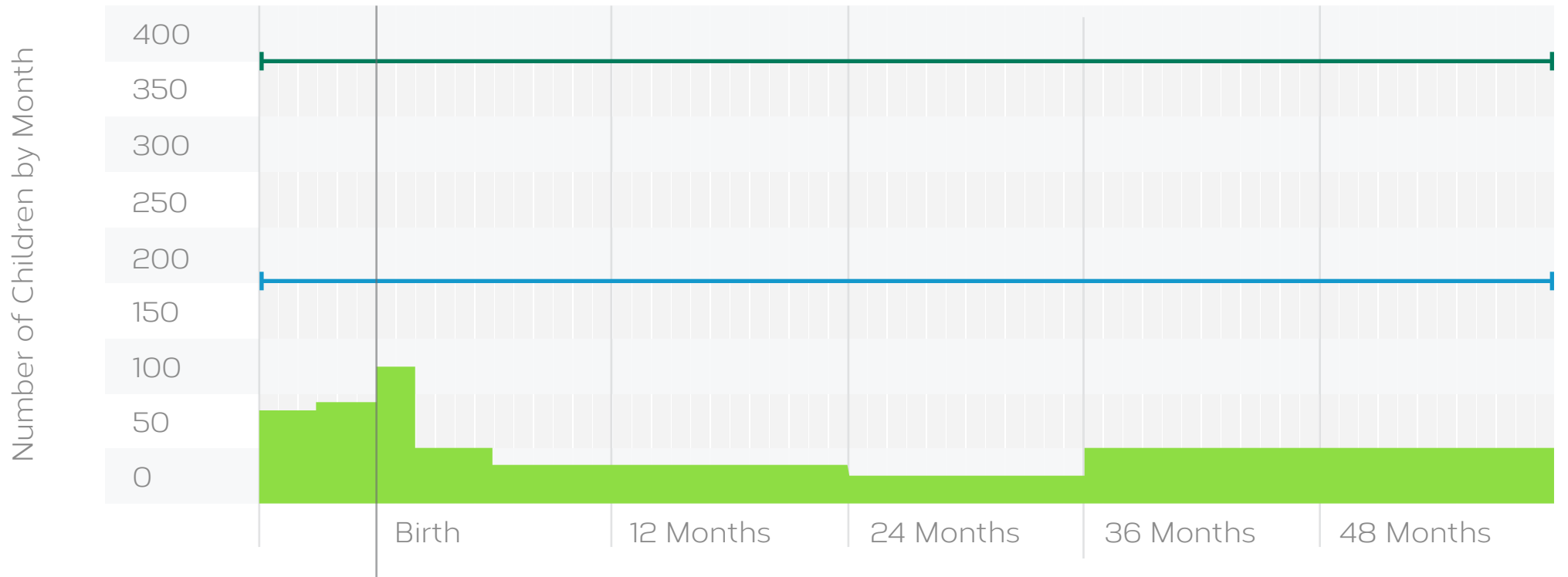

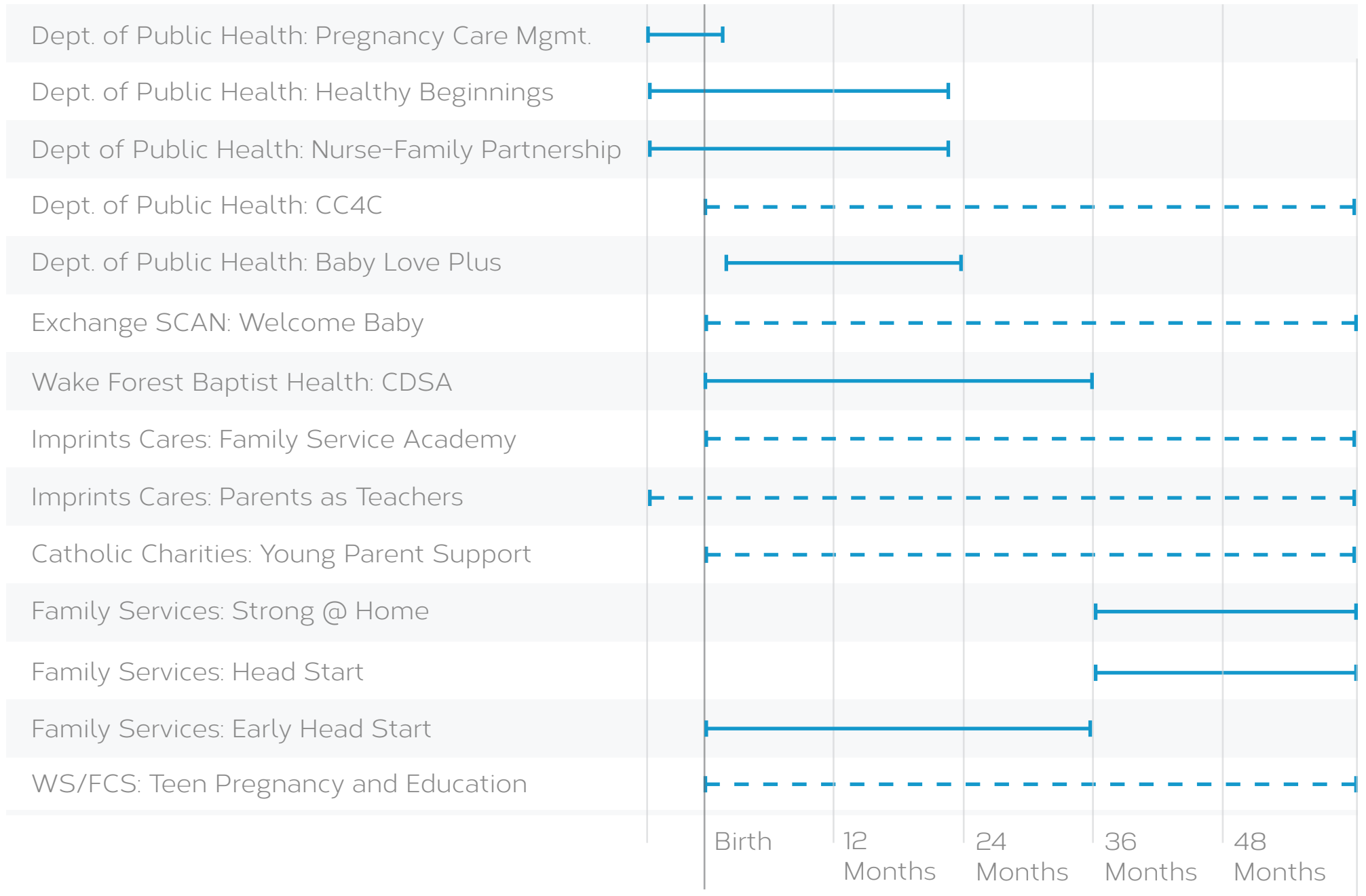
Case Management Service Distribution by Age

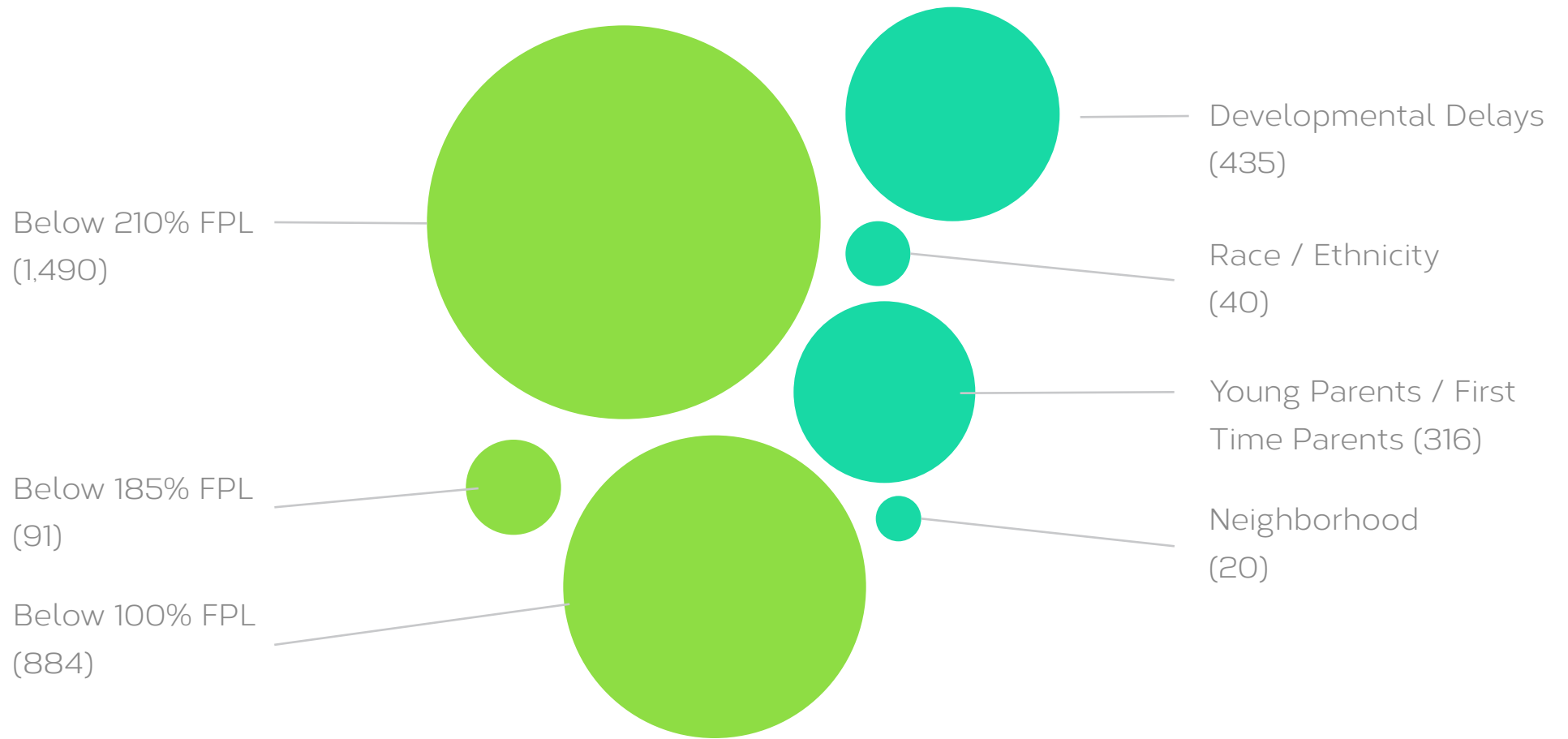

Income Based Criteria

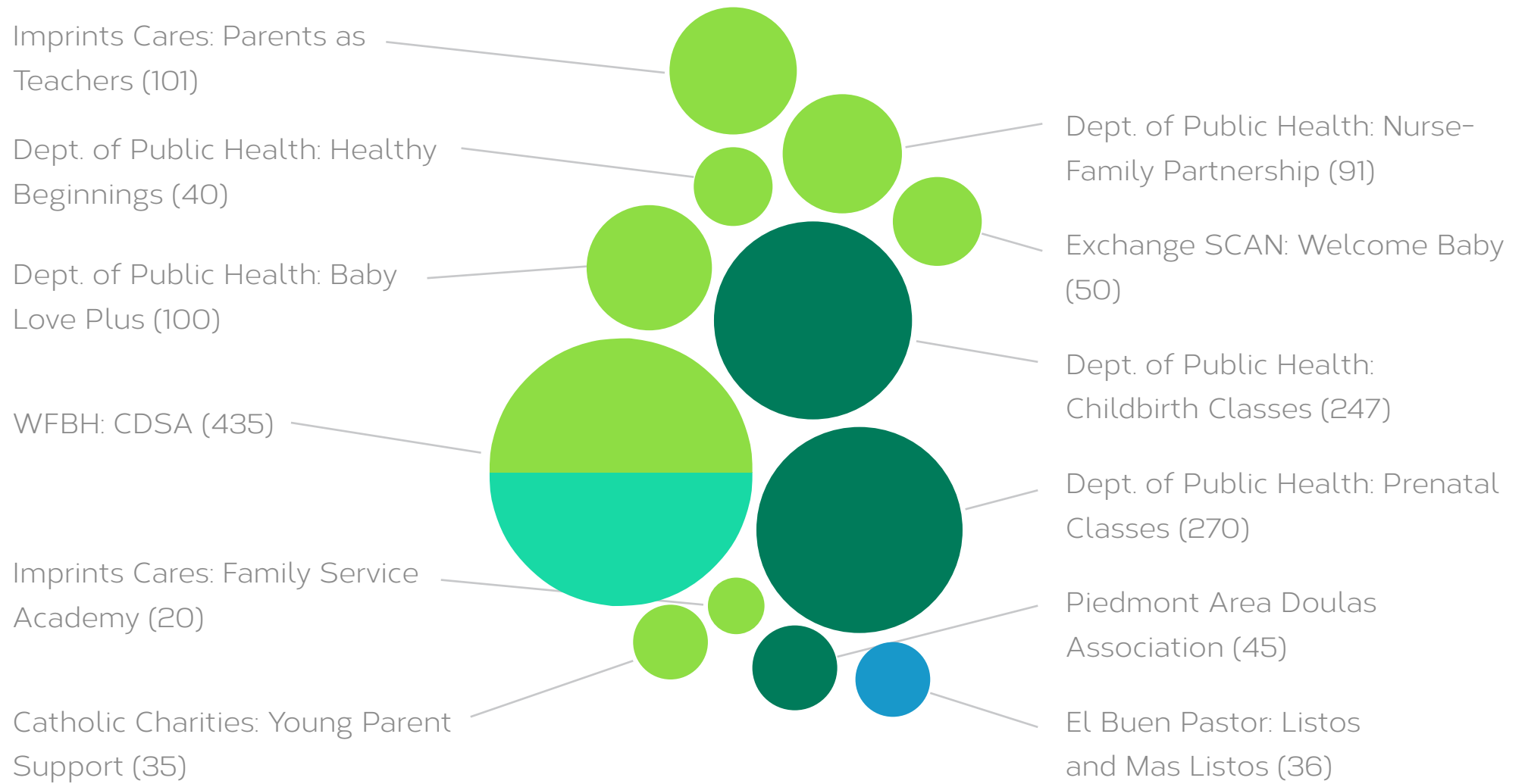
